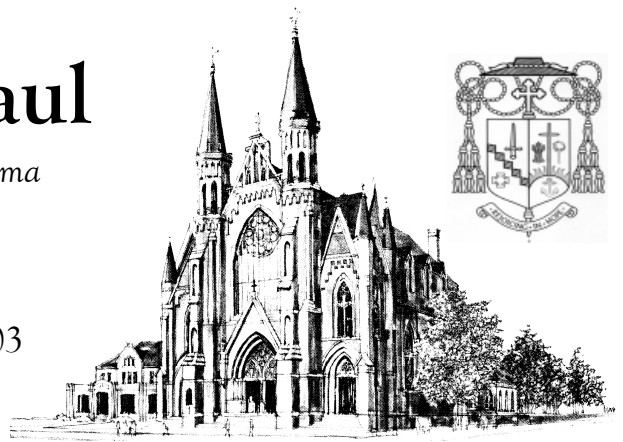

Anointing of the Sick

For those who have reached the use of reason and are in danger of death from sickness or old age. Anointing is ordinarily preceded by Confession. Contact a priest. In emergencies, call anytime.

Baptism

The Church instructs parents to seek baptism for their child within the first few weeks after birth. Contact the office, preferably during the pregnancy, to make the arrangements.

Holy Matrimony

Contact the Wedding Coordinator at least 6 months in advance. Subject to the Cathedral's wedding guidelines.

Contact the office prior to making arrangements with the funeral home. To learn about the columbarium, call the office.

Summer Employment – Diocese of Birmingham

Totus Tuus is a week-long summer program for the children and youth of our Diocese. Four college-aged missionaries visit a new parish each week to put on a program where children in grades 1-6 learn about the Rosary and the elements of the Mass, go to Confession and to daily Mass, and learn about Church teaching in a fun and engaging way. An evening program for youth in grades 7-12 includes talks on chastity and vocations, as well as a night of Adoration and confession. Totus Tuus is an authentically Catholic program designed to get kids and youth interested about the Faith.

We are looking for missionaries to put on our program for the summer of 2018! Each team is made up of 2 guys and 2 girls, who will travel around the Diocese and put on the program in a different parish each week. Housing will be provided by parish volunteers, as will food. Gas money and expenses for travel and supplies will be reimbursed. Each missionary will receive a total of \$1,575.00 (\$175/week for 9 weeks) as compensation for their work over the summer. The summer will begin with a week-long training session in Cullman starting May 27th and ending with the last parish on July 27th, with one week off for the Independence Day holiday. Missionaries should be currently enrolled in college, or have just graduated, and have a valid driver's license.
