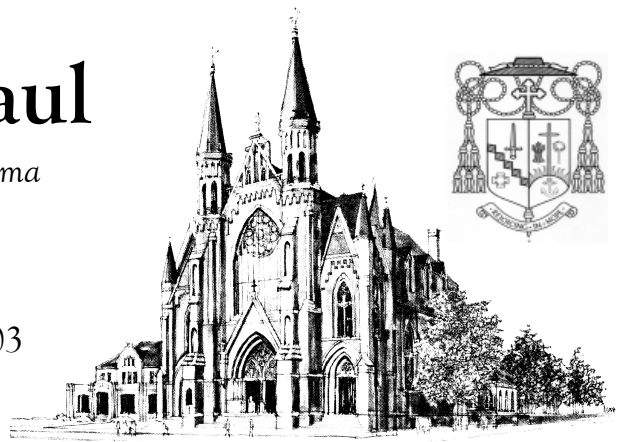

The Church instructs parents to seek baptism for their child within the first few weeks after birth. Contact the office, preferably during the pregnancy, to make the arrangements.

Contact the Wedding Coordinator at least 6 months in advance. Subject to the Cathedral's wedding guidelines.

The Red Mass is a Mass of the Holy Spirit which is celebrated annually at the opening of the judicial year to invoke divine guidance for all who seek and administer justice. This Thirteenth Century European custom received its name from the red color of the vestments worn by the celebrant and the scarlet robes worn by the Lord High Justices. In the United States today, a Red Mass is celebrated in most of the major metropolitan areas and is attended by judges, lawyers, public officials, law school faculty, students and the public.

St. Edith Stein Reflection

On Saturday, October 20, Sister Elisabeth Meadows, OSB, will lead a Day of Reflection focused upon the life and spirituality of St. Edith Stein (Teresa Benedicta of the Cross).
