ENTRANCE ANTIPHON *Salve, sancta Parens*

Ps 44:2

Salve, sancta Parens, eníxa puérpera Regem: qui cœlum terrámque regit in sæcula sæculórum.

✠ *Eructávit cor meum verbum bonum: dico ópera mea Regi. Glória Patri.*

Hail, holy Mother, who gave birth to the King Who rules heaven and earth world without end.

**GLORIA**

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. GOSPEL

Lk 1:39-47

At that time, Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town of Judah. And she entered the house of Zachary and greeted Elizabeth. And it came to pass, when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, that the babe in her womb leapt. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb! And how have I deserved that the Mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold, the moment that the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leapt for joy. OFFERTORY ANTIPHON *Elegi*

2 Chr 7:16

Elégi, et sanctificávi locum istum, ut sit ibi nomen meum, et permáneant óculi mei, et cor meum ibi cunctis diébus. / *I have chosen, and have sanctified this place, that My name may be there, and My eyes and My heart may remain there forevermore.*

## HOLY COMMUNION

We invite all Catholics who are properly disposed (i.e., in the state of grace and having fasted for one hour before communion) to come forward in the usual way to receive Holy Communion. All others, including our non-Catholic guests, may remain in their pews and join us in prayer.

Ps 148:20

*Non fecit táliter omni natióni: et iudícia sua non manifestávit eis.*

*He has not done thus for any other nation; His ordinances he has not made known to them.*

*Today's Mass Ordinary is Mass IX, in honor of Our Lady. The Advent hymn Rorate caeli is sung at the offertory, as needed, and the hymns Conditor alme siderum and Tota pulchra est (in a setting by Dom Pothier, OSB, in honor of Our Lady's Immaculate Conception), are sung after Holy Communion. The Marian antiphon for Advent and Christmas, Alma Redemptoris Mater, is sung after the Last Gospel.*

MARIAN ANTIPHON *Alma Redemptoris Mater*

*Alma Redemptóris Mater, quæ pérvia cæli Porta manes, et stella maris, succúrre cadénti, Súrgere qui curat pópulo: tu quæ genuísti, Natúra miránte, tuum sanctum Genitórem Virgo prius ac postérius, Gabriélis ab ore Sumens illud Ave, peccatórum miserere.*

*Holy Mother of our Redeemer, thou gate leading to heaven and star of the sea; help the falling people who seek to rise, thou who, all nature wondering, didst give birth to thy holy Creator. Virgin always, hearing that Ave from Gabriel's lips, take pity on us sinners.*
